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1. **QUESTION** *What is the difference between a variable and a constant?*
2. **ANSWER** A variable is a value that can change, while a constant is a value that remains the same.
3. **QUESTION** *What is the difference between a function and a relation?*
4. **ANSWER** A function is a relation in which each input has exactly one output, while a relation is a set of ordered pairs.
5. **QUESTION** *What is the difference between a linear and a non-linear function?*
6. **ANSWER** A linear function is a function whose graph is a straight line, while a non-linear function is a function whose graph is not a straight line.
7. **QUESTION** *What is the difference between a rational and an irrational number?*
8. **ANSWER** A rational number is a number that can be expressed as a fraction of two integers, while an irrational number is a number that cannot be expressed as a fraction of two integers.
9. **QUESTION** *What is the difference between a prime and a composite number?*
10. **ANSWER** A prime number is a number that has only two factors, 1 and itself, while a composite number is a number that has more than two factors.

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
