CONCLUSIONS

Abstract—The purpose of this study was to determine if there were differences in the prevalence of musculoskeletal disorders between two groups of nurses working in different departments of a tertiary care hospital. The prevalence of musculoskeletal disorders was determined by means of a self-administered questionnaire among 100 nurses from the intensive care unit (ICU) and 100 nurses from the medical-surgical department. The prevalence of musculoskeletal disorders was higher among ICU nurses than among medical-surgical nurses. The prevalence of musculoskeletal disorders was significantly higher among ICU nurses than among medical-surgical nurses in the following areas: neck pain, shoulder pain, elbow pain, forearm/wrist pain, hand pain, low back pain, and knee pain.

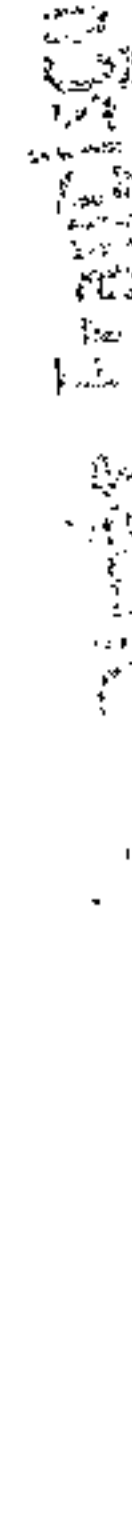
