2. Measure the refractive index of each solution using the refractometer. The refractometer should be calibrated using distilled water before use.
3. Record the refractive index for each concentration.
4. Plot the refractive index against the concentration of the solution.
5. Determine the relationship between the refractive index and the concentration of the solution.

The results of this experiment will be used to determine the refractive index of a solution of sucrose in water for different concentrations.
